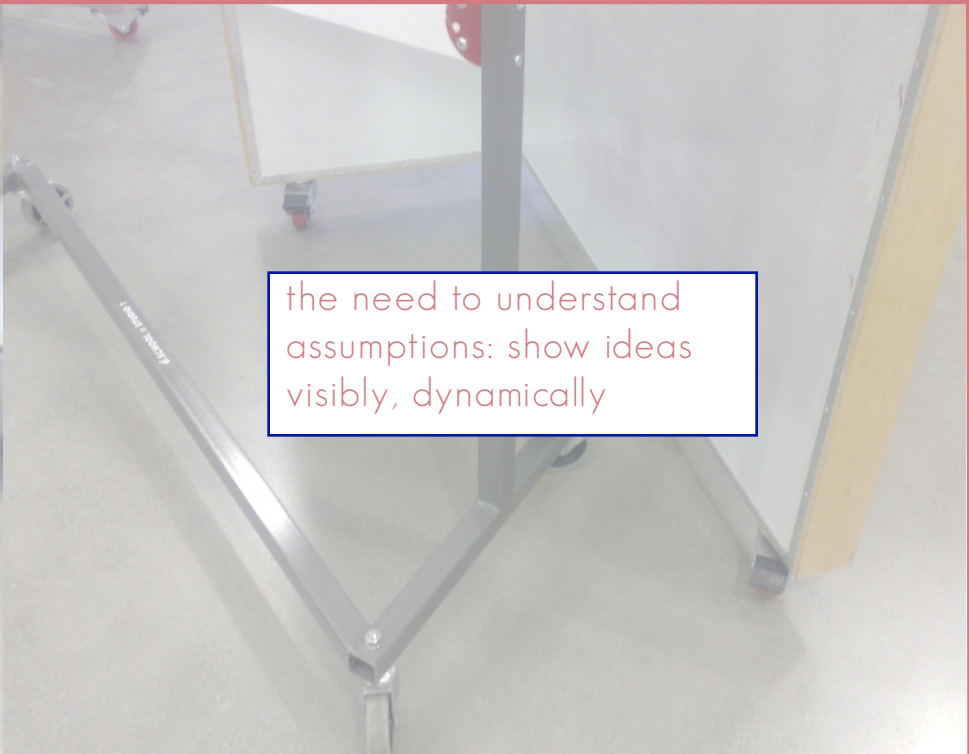




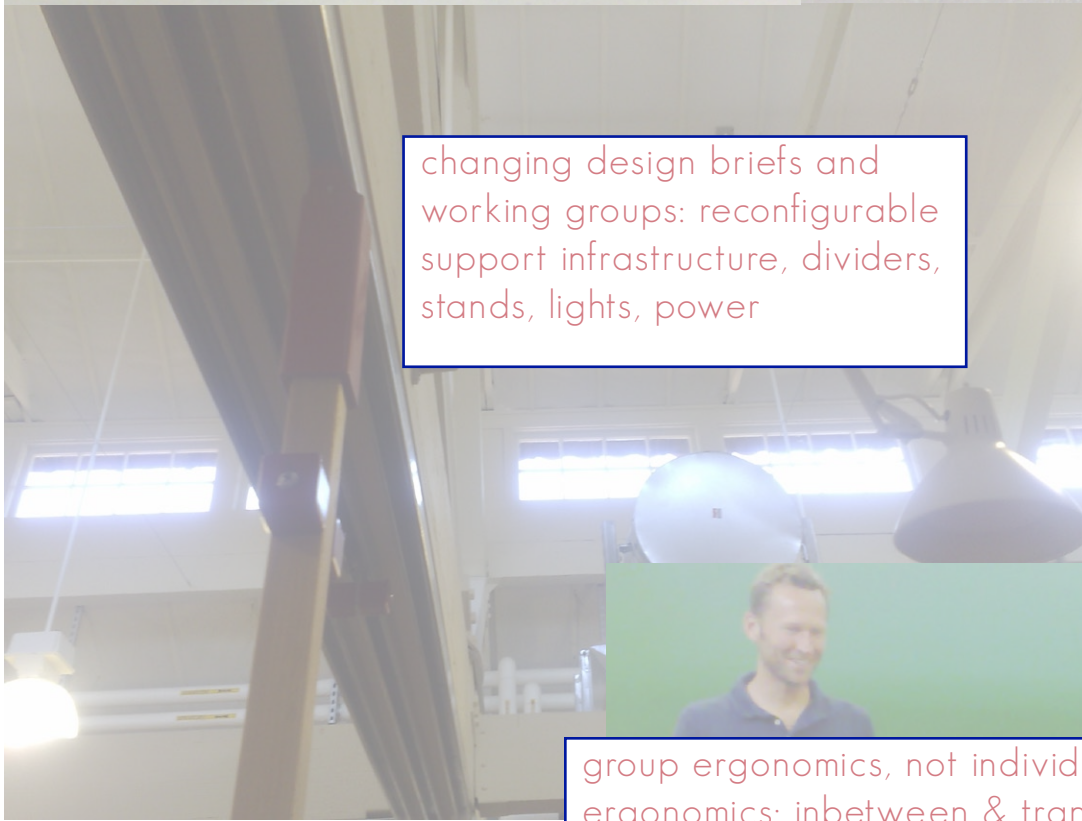
people condense around corners: Make a T-shaped space for sharing ideas

changing design briefs and working groups: reconfigurable support infrastructure, dividers, stands, lights, power



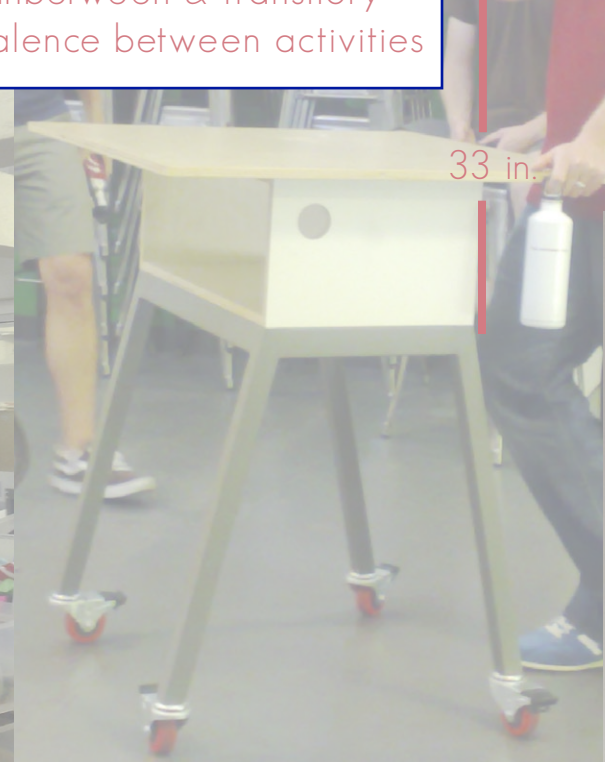
free association: freedom of movement and rest

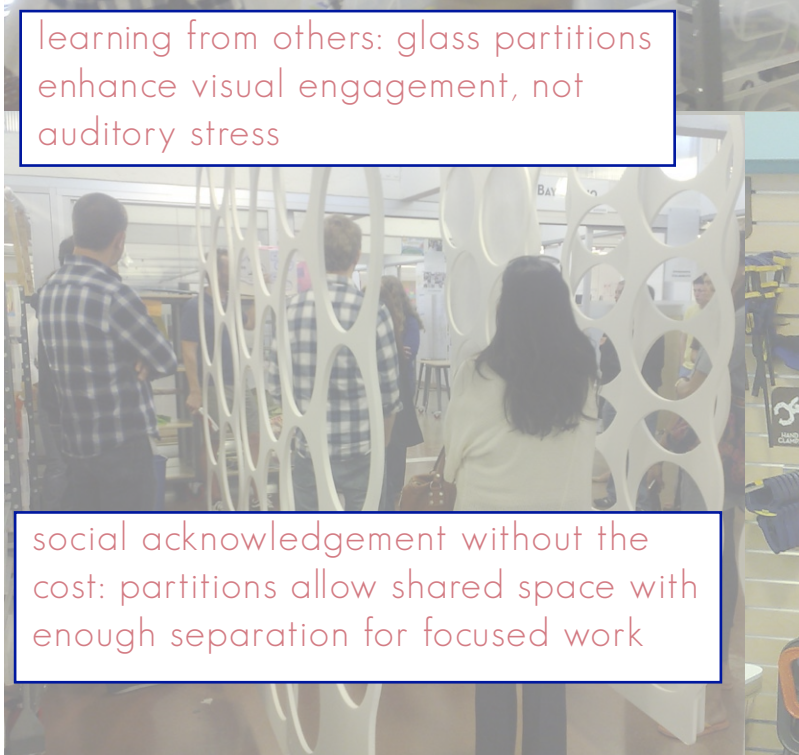

reduce visual clutter for clarity: partitions provide pattern and block views of necessary cluttered spaces

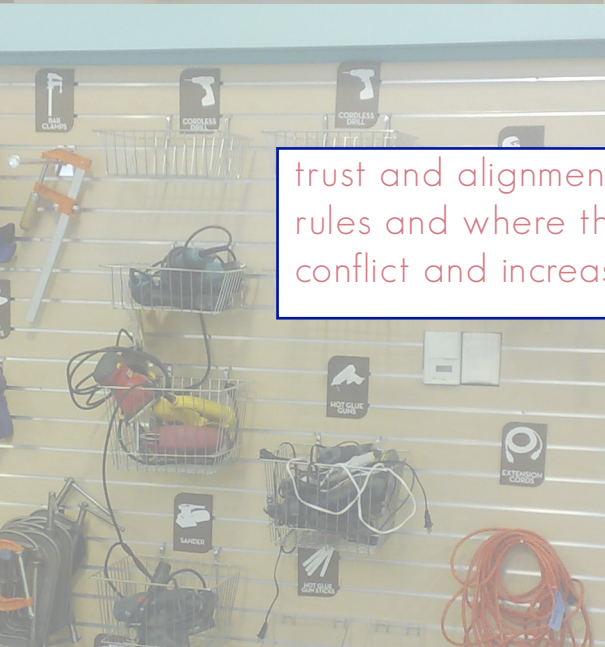


group ergonomics, not individual ergonomics: inbetween & transitory spaces for valence between activities



learning from others: glass partitions enhance visual engagement, not auditory stress

social acknowledgement without the cost: partitions allow shared space with enough separation for focused work



trust and alignment: knowing the rules and where things go reduces conflict and increases acquisition
